Washington Township has passed a resolution along with the Lucas County Commissioners and other Townships as advised by the Lucas County Engineers. This resolution focuses on obstructions in the road right of way to provide the safest possible highway system for the traveling public of Lucas County. The road right of way for all streets in the Township is 30 feet from the street line, or centerline of the road. The exceptions are Summit St., which is 120 feet, and Suder, Shoreland, and Stickney, which is 100 feet. Some common examples of obstructions in the road right of way include landscaping or planting screens, railroad ties, rocks, concrete/masonry blocks, and spikes. In short, any item that can be of danger to the motoring public is considered an obstruction. The Washington Township zoning resolution also states that planting screens or landscaping cannot interfere with public utilities, restrict pedestrian sidewalks, or otherwise constitute a traffic hazard. We would like to ask you to please help us maintain a safe community by keeping our road right of ways clear of obstructions and hazards in order to provide a safe haven for our motoring and pedestrian public. Keeping the road right of way clear also ensures that our road department can efficiently plow snow and perform maintenance duties.

Just a friendly reminder that you will need a zoning permit for construction or alteration of any building, including accessory buildings, and when changing the use of an existing building or accessory building to a different classification. Private pools require a permit along with outdoor signs, fences, and decks. If you occupy and use vacant land or change the use of the land to a different classification, you will need a permit. Any construction or reconstruction of a fence, pool, shed, gazebo, etc. also requires a zoning permit.

MDTs: The Washington Township Police Department had Mobile Data Terminals installed in every Township Police Vehicle. This was made possible by the generous voters of the Township and Lucas County through the 911 system. The MDTs will allow faster communication and information gathering on various items such as license plates and checking for warrants on individuals. In addition, we will be able to communicate with every police jurisdiction within Lucas County. The MDTs will allow us other time saving information by a grid/mapping system of every street in Lucas County.

Schools Open: The kids have gone back to school and we would like to remind everyone that during certain hours, the speed limit along Suder Avenue and East Harbor Drive is 20 mph. When approaching a school bus that has stopped to pick up or discharge passengers and has RED flashing lights activated, ALL TRAFFIC must stop, and must remain stopped until the bus starts to move or the bus driver motions you to pass. If you are cited for this violation, you must make an appearance in traffic court, and the fine is expensive. Please drive carefully.

Halloween: Halloween is just a few weeks away; it will be observed in the Township on Wednesday, October 31st from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Parents please take a moment and tell your children not to eat any of the goodies they receive until they have been inspected. In the past we have not experienced any problems but as in the past, the Fire Department will be sponsoring an inspection for all food items, free of charge, at the Township Fire Station between the hours of 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm.

Officer Phil: An exciting new school safety program will be launched by the WTPD after the first of the year called the Officer Phil program. This program will be presented to students of Shoreland School, and covers issues like drug abuse, stranger danger, gun safety, and other issues of safety that face our youngsters. We would like to thank the good folks at Kroger, Meijer, and Food Town for their generous community support for the Officer Phil program. The Washington Township Park District has been awarded a grant from the NatureWorks Program that will assist with some of the cost of demolition of the shelter house at Shoreland Park and construction of a new building in the same location. Vetter Design Group of Toledo has been hired to facilitate the project. The schedule calls for demolition of the shelter house before year-end, with construction starting in early 2002. Completion is scheduled for late summer. The Washington Township Park Board is comprised of three volunteer board members: Frank Grant, Steve Vaughn, and Bryon McIntosh, and clerk Dianne Wisniewski. Regular monthly meetings are held at 7:30 pm on the third Tuesday of every month at the shelter house. Beginning in November, meetings will be moved to the park building at 6126 Villamar Road until completion of the new shelter house.



Hello. I am Bryon McIntosh, your new Road Superintendent. I am a long-time resident of the Township and I will continue to give you the service you deserve. Our Road Department consists of me and an on-call crew of Glen McIntosh, Harry Thoman, Rick Phillips, Lucky Penn, and Tony Cochenhour. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me at 726-6908.

The Road Department has started its annual crack seal program that will cost the Township approximately \$1,324.00 in materials alone. We have been cleaning weeds from the streets in preparation to seal them before the winter months. After the roads are free of debris it takes about two weeks to seal the entire township. This preventative maintenance program has gained recognition from the Lucas County Engineers Department as it extends the longevity of our road surfaces.

We have also started the first phase of the Shoreland Heights project. This includes replacement or repair of curbs, sidewalks, and catch basins that need repair due to erosion. Since the construction can be affected by the Fall weather. We do not have a finish date for you at this time. Thank you for your patience and cooperation with the many inconvenient situations construction can cause.

Our leaf pick-up program will resume this Fall as soon as needed. Look for "leaf pick-up" signs in your area. Please remember to rake your leaves to the curb, not in the street, and also not close to parked cars. Also, please keep twigs and small branches out of the piles. The leaf-vac machine was purchased by the Township last year at a cost of \$3,500.00 and the expense to dispose of the debris at Kurtz Brothers totaled \$914.00. The Road Department has purchased a second dump truck for snow removal so we can continue to give you the best service possible. This will aid the expediting of the snow removal process and insure we will always have one truck on the road. The truck was purchased from Bi-State Ford at a cost of \$12,500 and was previously owned by Lucas County.

Please keep in mind if two or more inches of snow accumulate, all vehicles should be parked off the road right of way so our snow removal can be successful. We again would like to ask your cooperation in helping us keep our community a safe one by not shoveling or blowing snow back into the streets.

I would like to thank you for your cooperation on all of our projects!!

The exterior restoration of Township Hall is now in the works. J&B Construction was awarded the bid on this project. They will also construct a 20' x 40' pole barn in the side vard on David Drive. Additional storage is needed for both our Police Dept. and the Road Dept. Township Hall will be insulated with "EIPS" (exterior insulation finish system) and vinyl siding will top off this project.

Ken Kay has been actively involved with the Ottawa River RAPP program while Barb Shaheen has been working with the Lucas County Engineers on our road projects. Camille Hammer has been representing the Township in the "Maumee River Regional Storm Coalition" In conjunction with TMACOG. The purpose of the coalition is to develop and implement storm water management policies and procedures. By the Spring of 2003, the EPA will have strict laws and heavy fines in effect for violations in the watershed management.
