## Police Department

Warmer weather means increased security:

With the warmer weather upon us we all need to take an extra moment and think about added security in and around our homes. While most of us love to work in the yard and spruce up our bushes and lawns, take a moment and check the height of your bushes. Bushes allowed to grow high and thick near windows become a burglar's favorite hiding spot. They also impede our ability to check around your house as we cruise by. Also, please remember to close your garage doors at night. We would also appreciate it if you would take a moment and check to see if your address is displayed on your house or in your yard. Addresses are important for us so that we can find you quickly in an emergency.

## Zoning

Remember you will need a zoning permit for these things:

- Construction or structural alteration of any building including accessory buildings.
- Change in use of an existing building or accessory building to a use of a different classification.
- Private pools, outdoor signs, and fences.

When it comes to storing or parking of boats, recreational vehicles and utility equipment:

- Shall not have fixed connections to electricity, water, gas, sanitary sewer facilities, and at no time shall this equipment be used for living or housekeeping purposes.
- When it comes to cleaning, maintenance, loading or unloading, these vehicles shall not be parked or stored in a front yard for more than 72 hours.

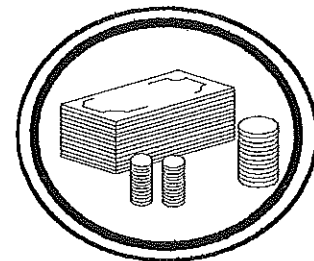

Our 2001 road project is in the works for Shoreland Heights (Holiday, Capri, Randon, and Jasik area). Approximately one half mile of curbing will be replaced, 18 catch basins will be repaired and three will be replaced. Some sidewalk replacement will be done and outside handicap accessible sidewalks will also be established. There is no funding or grant for this project and it is estimated that the cost to the Township will be approximately \$100,000.00. The 2001 project is being spec'd up by the Lucas County Engineers office and should be in our hands in late May or early June. In June, we will start the bidding process and by the end of July a contractor should be under contract. After the bidding process is complete, construction will begin in August and/or September. The residents will be notified before the actual construction will take place. This project is going to be very inconvenient to the residents. We would like to inform you in advance of some problems that will transpire and ask you for your cooperation with this project. Although traffic will be maintained, at certain intervals there will be no parking on the streets and no driveway approaches that will be accessible. Forms will have to be laid, the concrete poured, and a curing period of five days thereafter. As you can see, this will be a major inconvenience for the property owners. We hope an early warning of these upcoming events will help you better prepare yourselves. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Construction for the Shoreland Heights area is the first part of a two step project. The second phase will involve paving of the streets in 2003. This is being done in two phases because we will be using two different kinds of contractors, concrete, and asphalt, and secondly there is not enough funding available to do this all at once.

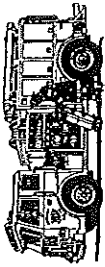

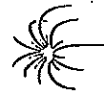
