FIRE

Discussion regarding parking restrictions during construction of the roundabout.

MOTION: To put up "No Parking" signs and to restrict parking within 60 feet of any of the corners where there are emergency fire routes.

Roll Call: Mr. Schuster yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Barto, yes.

Chief Bailey would like to add one thing regarding the above. He stated that he knows this is a point in contention for people when they have to cut through the neighborhoods on a semi regular basis to go on calls to the nursing home – for which their call volume is between 30 to 40% to that single address. They will be using that route a lot during the roundabout construction period. The Ohio Revised Code is very particular about how they address calls. There is a "Code 3" response, which is lights and sirens; there is a "Code 2" response, which is neither of those. There is no such thing as "Code 2 ½."

Chief said he knows it sounds great in theory to drive with just the lights on, with no audible tone, and it would keep it quiet through the neighborhood. He added that he can't say it doesn't happen sometimes because they are sympathetic to those people who are sleeping. He apologized but, for 45 days, residents might hear the sirens going through the neighborhood. They will try – as always – to be as respectful as they can.

MOTION: Status change for Alex Hartzell and Drew Lasley from probationary to badged members, effective May 12, 2025, with a pay increase to \$17.00/hour.

POLICE

Discuss purchase of 10 bulletproof vests.

Last month's discussion stated that the bullet proof vests have a five-year life span. Chief Kaiser explained that the vest is actually three parts: the ballistic panels, the carrier, and the extra carrier. The cost of each vest with the carrier is roughly \$1,500.00. If they spend that, the state will reimburse them \$1,200.00. It will end up being about \$300.00 to \$400.00 per vest. State of Ohio picks up about 75% of the cost. Mr. Mayfield spoke to Mrs. Nowakowski earlier today and, while this purchase was not budgeted, the police do have the money to purchase them.

Mr. Schuster asked what they do with the old ones? Chief Kaiser said they offer them to the fire department first. They have donated them to another agency down south in the past because some departments aren't able to purchase vests. They have also recycled them. When they donate them, they have the receiving agency sign a waiver acknowledging that there's no warranty and the Township is not liable or responsible if anything would happen.

MOTION: To allow Police Department to purchase 10 bullet proof vest systems, not to exceed \$15,000.00.

Mr. Mayfield, moved; Mr. Barto, seconded. Roll call: Mr. Schuster, yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Barto, yes.

Discuss purchase of new firearms.

Deputy Chief Hart shared that they started looking at purchasing new fire arms before they even moved into this building, so it's been in the process for several years, and their guns are now 15 years old. Over the years, they were able to raise the money to make this purchase.

The current credit on file is over \$10,000.00. With the trade-in from the existing firearms and other firearms they have on hand, it's just shy of another \$10,000.00. In total, they have \$19,561.00 available.

The total purchase of the new firearms and holsters would be \$13,600.00. The credit and trade-ins would allow them to purchase the new weapons and holsters and still have \$2,000.00 left over. Chief Kaiser stated this means no cost to the tax payers.

MOTION: Purchase of new firearms, not to exceed \$14,000, using credit from Vance's and Keistler's (this will be zero-dollar cost to tax payers).

Mr. Mayfield moved; Mr. Barto seconded. Roll: Mr. Schuster, yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Baro, yes.

MOTION: Approve the donation of confiscated, unclaimed clothing and violin to Washington Local Schools.

<u>ROADS</u>

Shoreland Heights/Curbs - Jasik neighborhood curb and road repair.

Mr. Mayfield feels they need to start looking into getting these repairs done, and believes it will take between \$50,000.00 to \$100,000.00 to make repairs in that neighborhood. He stated there is enough money in the Roads Fund to do it. Mr. Schuster stated \$50,000.00 to \$100,000.00 is a pretty big spread. Mr. Mayfield replied they're just not sure what it will cost; that's why they will get quotes.

Mr. Barto asked Mr. Breininger if he got estimates on the concrete repair part yet. Mr. Breininger replied he tried and none of the companies returned his calls. Mr. Mayfield said they are looking to do curb repairs in front of driveways, whatever concrete needs to be replaced, and black top issues. There is no action to be taken now to approve funds; they are just getting prices for cost for the repairs.

Mr. Mayfield explained it's a new year and the Township is looking to spend some of the stormwater money. He would like to discuss putting some of that money aside to do some sewer cleaning and there is a sewer line that is plugged.

MOTION: To hire Cleantech to do the work for stormwater piping and catch basin cleaning, not to exceed \$7,000.00.

Mr. Mayfield moved; Mr. Barto seconded.

Roll Call: Mr. Schuster, yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Barto, yes.

Mr. Mayfield stated that they would like to spend \$5,000.00 of the stormwater funds for ditch cleanup for the overgrowth. Lucas County will probably have to come do the work for us; they have the equipment to do what needs to be done. Ryan will work with the County and decide what area to cleanup first.

MOTION: Stormwater Fund for ditch cleanup of overgrowth, not to exceed \$5,000.00. Mr. Mayfield, moved; Mr. Barto, seconded.

Roll Call: Mr. Schuster, yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Barto.

Mr. Brittson asked if it's possible to do along the Summit Street Bridge so you can see down the river; it's such a good view. Mr. Mayfield replied that would be part of the cleanup.

Discuss sidewalks and tree issues.

Mr. Mayfield stated that sidewalks and tree issues have been discussed before and the Township receives tree and sidewalk calls all the time. Recently, a resident paid their own money to have healthy trees removed in the public right-of-way. The law is clear that the Township is not responsible for the sidewalks. The law is cloudy regarding if the sidewalk is damaged from a tree root on the Township's right-of-way. That is not as clear. Mr. Mayfield's opinion is the Township didn't plant the tree; most likely, the developer or the previous or current home owner did.

Toledo recently passed an ordinance about their sidewalk repairs. They tried to slip in an amendment that the city would be responsible for tree damage and it did not get passed. The city has passed the cost on to the residents - even if it's tree damage.

Mr. Mayfield said his wife walks the neighborhoods and, in just in two neighborhoods, there are over 100 bad sidewalk areas; most of it is leveling. Mr. Mayfield stated if there are 100 bad areas in two neighborhoods, there are probably about 300 to 400 total in the Township. There is nothing to be decided today, but it is an issue that needs further discussion and needs to be addressed.

In Mr. Breininger's report, he mentioned he would like to have three (3) willow trees removed on Villamar Road. The cost is \$3,600.00 to remove trees, stumps, and cleanup. Mr. Mayfield feels it is overpriced, but the trees definitely need to be removed.

MOTION: Contract with Tree Monkey to remove three (3) trees on Villamar, for \$3,600.00 - remove trees, stumps, and grindings.

Mr. Schuster moved; Mr. Mayfield seconded Roll Call: Mr. Schuster yes; Mr. Mayfield, yes; Mr. Barto, yes.

DELEGATIONS/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Futey

He is concerned with the people who are renting the Shoreland Park Shelter House and their guests not driving safely through the neighborhood when leaving their event. The people are speeding out of the park and running stop signs. He is concerned about safety for the residents and children who live and play in the area. Mr. Mayfield asked for the police to patrol the area close to the time when a party or event is over and guests are leaving.

MOTION: With no additional business or comments, Mr. Mayfield moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:08 p.m.
